The challenge

SDG Target 8.7:

- end child labour in all its forms by 2025
- end forced labour, modern slavery, human trafficking by **2030**.

Most prevalent in lower tiers of global supply chains, informal economy and in crisis situations. Link with other fundamental and labour rights violations.



Buenos Aires Declaration on Child Labour, Forced Labour and Youth Employment

96 **voluntary pledges** (54 by governments and regional groups), describing concrete and time-bound actions to advance Target 8.7

Alliance 8.7

Global partnership launched in September 2016 to accelerate action, share knowledge, drive innovation and leverage resources for national governments to achieve Target 8.7

Proposals for a G-20 strategy to end child labour and forced labour

- Promoting economic development, enterprise development and decent work to prevent and address child labour and forced labour
- 2. Building capacities in regions and countries
- 3. Accelerating ratification, legal action and law enforcement
- 4. Identifying high risk sectors, promoting social dialogue and due diligence
- 5. Conducting research and sharing knowledge
- 6. Driving innovation
