In Focus Group Discussions, lead farmers remarked that OSH TOT and awareness trainings are very important for individual farmers and others to improve knowledge and skills needed for safe work and to avoid creating hazards that could place themselves or others at risk.

"It is necessary for us to take a break for our safety. This allows us to improve our availability to work the next day...working in cooler temperatures allows us to be more productive as well".
